CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

The members of the *Réseau provincial de recherche en adaptation-réadaptation* (REPAR) and the *regroupement stratégique sur l'ingénierie de technologies interactives en réadaptation* (INTER) are coming together for the Scientific Day 2020 with the general theme:

"Innovating together to address intersectoral and interdisciplinary rehabilitation issues"

You are invited to submit an abstract for an oral presentation (young researcher competition) or a poster presentation (students, postdoctoral fellows and collaborators). The selection committee will evaluate all abstracts and notification of acceptance or rejection will be sent to each first author by email a few weeks after the submission deadline. You have until **Monday**, **February 17**, **2020**, to complete the abstract submission form and send it to the following address: repar.irglm@ssss.gouv.qc.ca</u>. Accepted abstract will be published as submitted and you may submit only one abstract as first author.

Some of the abstracts accepted for a poster presentation will also be selected for participation in the competitions, with a prize awarded for the best in each category (5): collaborators, master's students, doctoral students, postdoctoral fellows, and professional master's students. The rules for poster presentations are based on those of ACFAS: the abstract must state the rational and objectives, describe the methodology and present results that contribute to the advancement of knowledge. Abstracts may be submitted in English or French. **To be eligible for the competitions**, the student or fellow must be the presenter of the poster and the first author of the abstract as well as a member of one of the following organizations: REPAR or INTER. Abstracts that report a protocol (without results or with very preliminary results) or a narrative literature review may also be accepted for a poster presentation but will not be eligible for the competition. Each abstract eligible for a competition will be evaluated by two researchers to determine if it is selected for the poster competition.

A prize will also be awarded as part of the young researcher competition. You are eligible for this competition if you have been a researcher <u>for less than 3 years</u> and have not been previously awarded a prize from the competition. Previous prize recipients, however, may submit an abstract for a podium presentation.

HOW TO PRESENT YOUR ABSTRACT

Please complete the abstract submission form on pages 4 and 6. The abstract on page 6 must be written using the following criteria.

• Abstract title

The title of the abstract should be brief, (<u>Font: Times New Roman 11</u>) but sufficient to describe the nature of the research (maximum: 170 characters, including spaces).

• <u>Abstract</u>

The text of the abstract should not exceed **2000 characters, including spaces**. <u>Font: Times New Roman 11.</u> Abstracts not respecting these criteria will be rejected.

- <u>Funding</u>
- <u>Authors</u>

The surname of each author should be in capital letters followed by given name(s), preceded by a number that is used to refer to the author's affiliation(s).

Example: 1. SURNAME, Given name; 2. SURNAME, Given name

- <u>Affiliation(s)</u>
 - 1. Institution
 - 2. Research center, department, etc.

You must use the International System of Units (metric). For abstracts in French, capital letters must be accented where appropriate. The congress proceedings will be available on the REPAR website. The required dimensions for poster presentations will be announced at a later date.

All submission criteria must be met for an abstract to be considered by the selection committee.
